Word from the Principal



Dear Parents and Carers,

Over the past month our Secondary students have been preparing for their interhouse drama competition. The theme of the competition is the adventures of St Paul. The students have written their own scripts based on various chapters of St Paul's life from the Acts of the Apostles. The drama competition will take place in the College Hall starting 12:45pm. All parents and friends of the College are welcome to attend, but we ask you to please sign at the College Reception as per usual before proceeding to the College Hall.

This week we celebrate two important holy days, namely the feast of the Holy Cross, 14th September and also the feast of the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady 15th September. Both feasts speak of the cross and suffering as the royal road to greatness. *Palma sub onere crescit* is an ancient saying found on many royal coats of arms. It translates to "If we put a weight on a palm tree, it grows all the better under the weight."

I do not know if this ancient belief is true, but I know that a strong person will not break under trials but by the grace of God, uses them as steps on the ascent. Here's a classic example from antiquity: Julius Caesar (100-44 B.C.) landed in Africa. Stepping out of the boat, he stumbled and fell to the ground. His superstitious entourage see a "bad omen" in it. Caesar keeps his presence of mind and makes the most of the situation by crying: "Amplexor te, Africa! Africa, I embrace you!"

He turned his fall into success. Struggle and deprivation is not merely "trouble," but a source of heroic virtues. As the wise saying goes, "In every crisis there is an opportunity." Students too often only see the crisis. It takes a wise parent,

teacher or mentor to show them where the opportunity lies.

Dear parents, don't be afraid of imposing high expectations on your children. If there is no trial, there is no perseverance. If there are no mistakes made there will be few lessons well learnt. Whoever fights becomes stronger. Fr Toth wrote beautifully on page 58 of his book [The Young Man of Character by Tihamér Tóth | Goodreads](#) "Dante wrote his great work, *Divina Commedia*, in exile, in virtual poverty. Schiller wrote his most dramas while painfully ill. Mozart finished his Requiem in painful illness. It would not be good for a river if all the fish eggs turned into full grown fish; it would not be good for the garden if every flower turned into a fruit; and it is not good for a student to succeed in everything he or she starts. Lack of success teaches humility, whereas success makes one proud. Man can survive everything except continual well-being: 'Everything in the world can be endured except a long period of good days.' (Goeth) Because ease breeds disease!"

I wish you all the blessings of the Feast of the Holy Cross, 14th September and also the Feast of the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady on 15th September.

From the Deputy Principal

Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

As we move toward the end of Term 3, for many, hopefully, the end-of-year examinations come into focus.

From Year 9 through to Year 12, over the coming months students will be required to complete exams in one or more subjects. Our current VCE students commenced this process by undertaking the General Assessment Test (GAT) last week on Wednesday, 7 September.

Preparing for these assessments takes time. It is important for students to start exam preparation early, to give themselves the best chance of retaining the information they need and giving it the meaning that will help them excel.

I was recently fortunate to be privy to some advice from some of our State's leading Universities. It is worth noting that students achieving the highest results in VCE studies report that they spend 3 - 4 hours per night, and up to 6 hours over the weekend on studying. They also identify that they complete as many practice exam papers as possible, with an average of 5 practice papers per subject.

As I have articulated in previous Chronicles the College has a structured homework policy that sees time spent on work outside the classroom scaffolded across a child's journey at the College. Parents should expect that children are coming home and undertaking this independent style of study.

Upon returning from holidays, students will be provided with a 'Tips for Exam Preparation' handout to review and implement during their respective exam phase.

With Term 3 coming to a close, interim reports will be opened at the conclusion of this week and the booking process for Parent-Teacher Interviews is

open. Upon receiving the interim report, please take the time to sit with your child and discuss the faith, academic, social and emotional learning that has taken place this term. When we engage in these conversations we place a value on learning. This value is recognised by students and can contribute to the attainment of success.



This week we provided the 2023 aspiring Student Leaders with an insight into the process or the selection of the College Captains and Vice captains. There was a sense of optimism in the room as students sought clarification and shared their own stories with each other on their view of what it means to be a leader.

A reminder that the College has a social media presence on Instagram and will use this as a platform to showcase some examples of what is taking place across a range of areas within the College.

I wish everyone a safe and restful holiday and look forward to returning to what will no doubt be a very busy yet exciting term.



The SEVEN SORROWS of the BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

(15th September)

The Church twice commemorates the sorrows of its heavenly Mother. The Friday of Passion week, since the 15th century, has also been dedicated by the universal Church to

Her *Compassion*. Why is this so? To understand this double liturgy, we must know that Mary is also the Mother of the Mystical Body. The present feast was instituted by Pius VII after his return from his captivity and exile, which lasted from 1809 to 1814. Christ no longer suffers, and for Our Lady also, all suffering as we understand it has ceased. Nonetheless, the prophet Jeremias in his Lamentations, asks: "To whom shall You be compared, O Virgin? Your affliction is like the ocean." A mother who is happy in her home weeps just the same over the sorrows of her children. The statues and pictures of Mary all over Europe wept before the Revolution in France, and Her statues weep again today, in many places. The Passion of Christ continues in His elect, in particular in His Vicar on earth, from whom He does not separate Himself, and against whom the force of hell is deployed unceasingly. The



mysterious *compassion* of the Mother is forever acquired for the Mystical Body of Her Son, which must reproduce the divine death in its human nature, elevated above its natural condition by the superhuman power of grace.

Mary's great sorrows began at the prediction of Simeon that a sword would transpierce Her heart. Soon afterwards, She was obliged to flee with the newborn Infant, already object of a fatal search. She lost Him in the temple for three inexpressibly painful days; She met Him on the road to Calvary, and the sight indeed pierced Her heart. She saw Him die, heard His final cry, and witnessed the opening of His side with the effusion of His last drops of blood, mingled with

water; She received in Her arms the inert body of the most beautiful of the sons of men. Finally, She was obliged to depose Him in a tomb, leave Him there and return with Her adopted son, John, to a deicidal Jerusalem.

The Queen of Martyrs has never ceased to encourage Her children on earth to bear their own crosses, which complement the Passion of Christ. He suffered first the ordinary contradictions of life; for three years He was taunted and regarded as a menace by those who should have recognized Him and His mission. He knew hunger, cold and fatigue; He slept so heavily in a boat amid a tempest, that we can only suppose He was exhausted. He knew what it was to be abandoned in need and to lose, to the empire of various passions, followers He had called His. Christ is our forerunner in all human sorrows and difficulties. Mary, as His Mother, offered to God with Him all the afflictions of His earthly life, and She continues to offer those of the Church, for its sanctification, for the souls in Purgatory and the salvation of souls.
